These pronouns can be used alone. You supply *man*, *woman*, *thing*, *men*, *women*, *thing* after *this* (in the singular) *these* in the plural depending on the gender of the pronoun.

example: **hic** est laetus – **This man** is happy. **hic** is masc and singular so you translate it as **this man**

These pronouns can be used as adjectives with a noun. In this case they agree with the gender, number and case of the noun. The translation is just *this* or *these*. Nothing else is added except the definition of the noun in the same gender number and case.

example: **hic rex** est laetus – **This king** is happy. **hic** and **rex** are in the same gender, number and case so **hic** is translated as *this*. Nothing else is added except the meaning of the word **rex**.

More examples:

huius villa est magna – This man's house is large
This woman's house is large

huius mercatoris villa est magna — **This merchant's** house is large

hunc iuvabo – I will help **this man**

hunc equum iuvabo – I will help this horse

Cum his pugnabamus – we were fighting with these men we were fighting with these women

Cum his militibus pugnabamus – we were fighting with these soldiers
