Imperfect Tense

- imperfect tense is a tense that takes place in the past, but emphaizes the duration of the action
- it is usually translated with was or were and then the verb with ing added
- sometimes it is translated as used to and then the verb

example: ambulabamus- we were walking or we used to walk

- To form the imperfect tense follow these simple steps
- 1. take the 2^{nd} principal part (the one that ends in -re)
- 2. drop off the –re
- 3. add the letters -ba-
- 4. add the personal endings:

-m=I -mus=we

-s=you -tis=you

-t=he, she, or it or a noun -nt= they, or a plural

noun

narra-ba-nt=they were telling, or they used to tell

Future Tense

- 1. take the 2nd principal part
- 2. drop the -re
- 3. add -bo -bi--bu-
- 4. add the personal endings

--- (the o is already added when you add *bo*) -mus

-s -tis

-t -nt

Add –bo in the 1st form

Add -bu- in the last form with the -nt

Add -bi- everywhere else

iuva**bo** – I shall help iuva**bi**s – you will help iuva**bi**t – he (etc) will help iuva**bi**t – they will help
