

Vocabulary #1 First Declension Nouns

- When a noun is listed in a dictionary two forms are given.
- The first one is the nominative singular form.
- The second is the genitive singular. The genitive singular is important because it is how you get the BASE of the noun.
- To get the base, drop off the genitive singular ending. For all first declension nouns the genitive singular ending is **-ae**.
- Most nouns of the 1st declension are feminine. This will be important later when you learn adjectives.
- 3 nouns in this list are masculine. Please note this because it will be important later.
- Memorize the meanings and spelling and practice saying the words correctly.
